The Goals of the Minor

The minor in Psychology is designed to:

- a) provide each student with a sampling of representative fields within psychology,
- b) provide each student with a basic introduction to the research methods employed in the field.
- c) allow enough flexibility for each student to pursue a particular sub-area of interest.

The Structure of the Minor (Total hours required = 23 hours)

Content Core (12-14 hours)

PS 101 Introduction to Psychology / SW 250 Psychological Inquiry / NW 220 Behavior Science, (3-5 hours)

and any THREE of the following:

PS 202 Learning (3 hours)
PS 235 Biological Bases of Behavior (3 hours)
PS 320 Life Span Developmental Psychology (3 hours)
PS 350 Social Psychology (3 hours)
PS 385 Cognitive Processes (3 hours)
PS 440 Psychology of Personality (3 hours)

Methodological Core (6 hours)

PS 210 Research Methods / Statistics I (3 hours)
PS 211 Research Methods / Statistics II (3 hours)

Advanced/Specialized Course (3 hours)

Any ONE PS 300-400 level course (3 hours). If PS 320, PS 350, PS 385 or PS 440 has not been used to satisfy the "content core" requirement (above), it may be used to satisfy the "advanced/specialized courses" requirement.
