#### **Parking Instructions:**

There are two great places to drop off and pick up your students. We have structured your tour to start at our recommended drop of location, in front of Holcomb Observatory. You'll end at the Atherton Bulldog on Hampton Dr as our recommended location to pick up at the end of your visit.

If you are going to enjoy lunch on campus after your tour, we recommend using Holcomb Observatory as your drop off and pick up location.

Buses are welcome to park in the Hinkle Fieldhouse Parking Lot (#24) for the duration of your visit.

#### **Brown Bag Lunch Recommendations:**

Holcomb Observatory	<ul> <li>The observatory is the largest in the state of Indiana</li> <li>One of the best places in the state to view an eclipse</li> <li>We have a planetarium that let you study the constellations</li> <li>People can buy a star and name it</li> </ul>
Bell Tower	<ul> <li>How many steps does it take to get to the top? 52</li> <li>It has 23 bells and goes off every hour</li> <li>On Sunday there is a "show" at 5pm</li> <li>Official name is Mrs. James Irving Holcomb Memorial Carillon</li> </ul>
Health and Recreation Center	<ul> <li>Many students partake in club and intramural sports</li> <li>Jogging track, pool, 2 basketball courts, and lots of weights</li> <li>A lot of students work here</li> <li>You can see a doctor or counselor here. Students use this space to stay healthy</li> </ul>
Hinkle Fieldhouse	<ul> <li>Tony Hinkle, who the building is named after, helped create the orange basketball</li> <li>9,100 people can sit inside for a game, but almost 10,000 fit inside</li> <li>Home to mens and womens basketball and volleyball, but we have 20 Division I teams</li> <li>95 years old</li> <li>Hosted Circus, NCAA tournament, it was an army and navy barracks in WWII</li> </ul>
Esports**	<ul> <li>There are 50 gaming computers inside</li> <li>Opened in 2022</li> <li>We have a competitive esports team that competes against other colleges</li> </ul>
Clowes Memorial Hall	<ul> <li>How many seats do you think are in Clowes? 1200.</li> <li>Katy Perry performed here for students one year</li> <li>Built in 1963</li> <li>Broadway shows like Lion King, actors, and presidents have all visited Clowes</li> </ul>
Lacy School of Business	<ul> <li>Popular LSB majors are Exploratory Business, Marketing, and Finance. Does anyone have an interest in studying business in college?</li> <li>There is a cafe, classrooms, and places for students to hang out</li> <li>During their first year business students will run their own business</li> <li>Our Career office is located here to help students find jobs</li> </ul>
Irwin Library	<ul> <li>Irwin Library and the World Trade Center were designed by the same person</li> <li>Opened in 1963</li> <li>There are over 400,000 books inside and 17,000 musical scores</li> </ul>

Star Fountain**	- One of the traditions for seniors is to visit all the fountains on campus during their last semester
Atherton Marketplace	<ul> <li>A hub of student involvement</li> <li>Volunteer Center is inside</li> <li>Where students go to eat their meals</li> </ul>
Efroymson Diversity Center**	<ul> <li>Groups that are focused on diversity have spaces in here, but it is an open space for all students to come hang out and make new friends</li> <li>Prayer/meditation space, kitchenette, and a lounge space</li> <li>There are over 160 student organizations on campus and many of them work with the DC</li> </ul>
Irvington House	<ul> <li>A dorm where students live when they move to campus for the school year</li> <li>Study places, fitness center, laundry, kitchen, lounges to hang out in are all in the dorm</li> <li>How many beds do you think Irvington has? 647</li> <li>Most of our students live on campus for 3 years</li> </ul>
Greek House**	<ul> <li>Butler has 7 fraternities and 8 sororities on campus.</li> <li>Combine for 20,000 hours of volunteering</li> <li>Great way to connect with former butler students and make new friends</li> <li>It isn't for everyone - about 35% join each year</li> </ul>
Atherton Stone Bulldog	<ul> <li>Butler was founded in 1855, and our founder, Ovid Butler, was ahead of his time in providing everyone, regardless of gender or race, an equal opportunity for exceptional education</li> <li>Blue 4 is our current live mascot</li> </ul>


**Esports** is located under the parking garage.
