

TRANSFER AGREEMENT
Between
Butler University
and
Ivy Tech Community College Statewide

For Transfer of Ivy Tech Community College's Associate of Arts degree in Liberal Arts to a
Bachelor of Science; Major: Youth and Community Development

Statement of Purpose

The purpose of this transfer agreement is to provide a basis for a cooperative relationship between Butler University and Ivy Tech Community College (ITCC) to benefit students who desire to complete a bachelor's degree. The intent is for ITCC students completing the AA degree program to move seamlessly to the BS degree program.

Transfer Agreement

Ivy Tech Community College graduates from the appended **Associate of Arts** degree program of study in **Liberal Arts** from any Ivy Tech campus, may transfer and apply a minimum of 60 credit hours from that completed degree to the requirements for Butler University's **Bachelor of Science** degree in **Youth and Community Development**.





Additionally, under the terms of this agreement:

1. Ivy Tech students are eligible for admission with junior standing to Butler University provided:
 - a. The student has submitted a complete transfer application for admission to Butler University.
 - b. A course grade of "C" or better must be earned to be accepted for transfer.
 - c. The student has a 3.0 or higher grade point average on a 4 point scale.
2. As ITCC graduates complete the credit hour requirements for the award of the BS degrees in Education (with a Major in Middle Secondary Education/Spanish Concentration), they must meet the graduation requirements as approved by Butler University at the time of the student's admission to the appropriate degree program.
3. Written notice of intention to terminate, modify, or withdraw from this Articulation Agreement will be submitted by the academic head of either institution at least one academic semester prior to the proposed date of termination/withdrawal. Should a decision be made to modify or dissolve this agreement, students who are already attending Butler University at the time will be permitted to continue as long as their academic performance remains in good standing.
4. Recognizing that changes in curricula and course content are inevitable, each institution agrees to discuss with the other institution all curriculum changes affecting this agreement before the changes are implemented.
5. This agreement becomes effective when all signatures are affixed and remains in effect for three years from the date below. After three years, the agreement may be renewed with or without modification by mutual agreement of both Ivy Tech Community College and Butler University.



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

**All YCD Majors pursue a concentration in one of six areas:

- Arts Administrations
- Entrepreneurship and Innovation
- Museum Studies
- Organizational Leadership and Communication
- Sociology with an Emphasis in Social Work
- Sport Coaching

The concentration elective in the AA degree is meant to help clarify the concentration the student plans to pursue and/or provide the introductory level course in the concentration they have chosen.

*** Candidates have enough elective hours expand their concentration area to a minor/major, add a second concentration area or pursue another minor interest.

****126 hours are required for graduation from the program. At least 40 of the 126 hours needed for graduation must be in upper division courses - courses numbered 300 or above.

4 Butler Cultural Requirements must also be documented before graduation.

Students must complete their final 30 hours at Butler and at least 40 hours of the total curriculum must be courses numbered at the 300 level or above.

NOTE: In addition to general Butler transfer requirements noted in the application process, the College of Education requires a 3.0GPA (College Transcripts).
