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PLACEMENT, DUAL ENROLLMENT, AND TRANSFER CREDITS

BUTLER LANGUAGE PLACEMENT CREDITS (BLPCs)

Request 200-level elective BLPCs after completing two 300-level Butler courses in the same language, each with a C- or better.

Placement and transfer credits below the 300 level are capped at nine. If you transfer in 100-level or 200-level credits from another institution or dual enrollment, you may not receive as many credits as listed above.

AP/I.B./CLEP

Credits can be earned automatically from Advanced Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate (I.B.), and CLEP (College Level Examination Program) exams.

- 4 or 5 on each AP exam: three 300-level elective credits (for each) *
- 5-7 on I.B. ab initio (SL) exam: three 100-level elective credits, placement into 102 of the same language
- 5-7 on I.B. Level B (SL) exam: three 100-level elective credits, placement into 203 of the same language
- 5-7 on I.B. Level B (HL) exam: five 300-level skills elective credits, placement into 300-level skills of the same language or permission from the department chair for alternate placement*
- 50 on CLEP exam: meet with MLLC department chair to discuss placement

*In addition to these, you may still be eligible for up to nine 200-level elective BLPC's. Note: AP/I.B./CLEP elective credits do not count as Butler courses toward BLPC eligibility, and they will not waive the language requirement for the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences. If you do not begin at the level noted, you will forfeit all language AP/IB/CLEP placement credits.

DUAL ENROLLMENT CREDITS

Students who have completed dual enrollment course work in high school with an accredited higher education institution and plan to continue with that language should enroll in the next sequential course.

Advanced language skill courses are not sequential. Students whose next sequential course will be 300+ are encouraged to enroll in a course that they feel will improve their linguistic and cultural skills.

If dual enrollment transfer credits have not been approved prior to the student's registration appointment, the student will need a permission number to enroll in the next sequential course. Please contact the MLLC department chair to obtain a permission number.

You may still be eligible for some 200-level elective BLPC's.

TRANSFER CREDITS

Prior to taking language courses at another institution while you are a student at Butler, please provide the appropriate department chair with a transfer credit request form to obtain Butler course equivalencies (if any):

- American Sign Language: Communication Sciences and Disorders
- Greek and Latin: History, Anthropology, and Classics
- All other languages (including those not offered at Butler): Modern Languages

Complete the personal information, institution name, term, and course titles on the form, but do not complete the "transfer as BU course" field. Attach a syllabus and a course description with the form. Once the department chair assigns equivalencies, proceed with remaining signatures and submit to you primary Dean. Have the institution submit an official transcript to Butler once the course is completed.

MEDICAL SPANISH

In Modern Languages, we recognize the following courses offered by the Butler College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences:

- RX 481/BSHS 481 Intro to Medical Spanish (200-level elective)
- RX 482/BSHS 482 Advanced Medical Spanish (300-level skills elective)
- RX 483/BSHS 483 Medical Spanish Service Learning (ICR) (300-level skills elective)
- RX 484/BSHS 484 Medical Spanish Language Immersion Trip (300-level skills elective, if placed at 300 level)

Up to six 300-level RX/BSHS credits can count towards completion of a Spanish major. Up to three 300-level RX/BSHS credits can count towards completion of a Spanish minor.

RX Medical Spanish courses do not count towards the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences Language Requirement.
