Recipe for the top view jello brain:

- 3 large (6 oz) boxes of jello (peach or watermelon recommended)
- 1 can (12 oz) evaporated skimmed/fat-free milk
- A few drops of green food coloring (to change the color to gray)
- 3.5 cups of water (2.5 cups boiled; 1 cup cold)
- 1. Coat mold with vegetable oil or spray
- 2. Add 2.5 cups of boiling water into jello. Stir and dissolve jello.
- 3. Stir in 1 cup of cold water.
- 4. Stir in skimmed milk (~2 minutes)
- 5. Add a few drops of green food coloring
- 6. Pour entire mixture into jello mold
- 7. Place mold into refrigerator overnight.

Get jello molds in the shape of the brain at <u>Archie McPhee</u>. For about \$12 (plus shipping) you get either a gelatin mold of the top half of the brain or a side (lateral) view of the brain. Make brains over and over again. You can also model the <u>meninges (coverings)</u> of the brain by using layers of plastic wrap on top of your jello brain. Make sure everyone gets a taste. Now that's what I call brain food!
