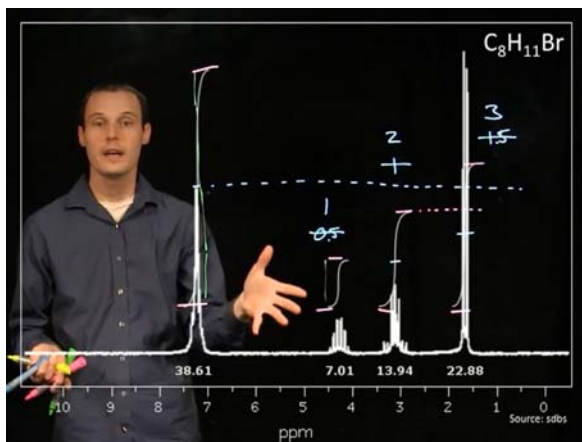

The purpose of the grant is to foster innovative teaching and learning through the use of [Lightboard technology](#). ATIG is a nine month grant program that begins in July 2017 and lasts through April 2018 and is open to all Butler University faculty (tenured, tenure track, non-tenure track, and adjunct faculty).
