### CAT Announces New Team Member!

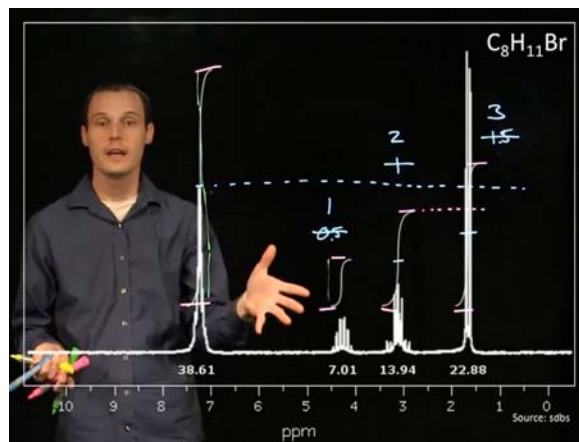
