The Jazz Studies Minor has the following performance attendance requirement: the student must attend a minimum of 16 events during his/her matriculation at Butler, regardless of the number of semesters of enrollment as an official Jazz Studies Minor. Of these events, 8 must be in music, 2 in dance, 2 in theatre, 2 in art or arts-related lecture events, and 2 of the student's choice. Records are maintained in the JCA office.

Students fulfill the Perspectives of the Creative Arts requirement of the University Core Curriculum when they have completed 9 credit hours of music courses.
