

B.A. IN MUSIC PLUS A SECONDARY MAJOR IN SPANISH

- The B.A. degree in Music requires 124 credits.
 - 66 hours must be non-music credits.
 - 40 hours must be 300 or 400-level courses.
 - All music majors have Arts Event Attendance Requirements; for details, check https://www.butler.edu/jca/for-current-students.
- The Spanish major consists of 33 hours in the language. At least 24 of these hours must be at the 300-level or above, including at least one Skills course, at least two Culture/Literature courses, and at least one Linguistics course; at least 18 credits must be from SP 325-SP 499. At least two courses must be at the 400-level. All courses must be completed with a "C-" or better. Students who major in Spanish normally include study abroad in their programs.
- The double major of Music and Spanish will fulfill the following Areas of Inquiry in the University Core Curriculum: Perspectives of the Creative Arts and Texts and Ideas. In addition, if a student completes nine or more hours abroad in approved courses, they can have one Global and Historical Studies (GHS) course waived. The B.A. Music curriculum fulfills the Social Justice and Diversity requirement of the Butler University Core Curriculum; music majors are exempted from the Butler Cultural Requirement because of the arts event attendance requirements for all arts majors. The Indianapolis Community Requirement is NOT satisfied.
- Students may earn Butler Language Placement Credits (BLPC), in addition to credits from their Advanced
 Placement and International Baccalaureate exams (up to nine 200-level elective credits toward the major's
 overall credit requirement, and up to six 300-level Skills elective credits). For more information, including how
 exactly to earn these credits, please visit www.butler.edu/mllc.
- Up to six credit hours of 300-level RX/BSHS medical Spanish coursework can count as approved electives.
- The student will be assigned a Spanish advisor in addition to their Music advisor.
