E. PERFORMANCE ASSESSMENT REQUIREMENT

Both pedagogy and content tests (also known as PRAXIS exams) are required for licensure in the state of Indiana. The testing provider for the State of Indiana is ETS. **Candidates shouldrequest that scores be sent to BOTH Butler and the Indiana Department of Education.** Information can be found here: www.ets.org/praxis/in and on the COE Student Canvas site.

F. CPR/HEIMLICH/AED and SUICIDE AWARENESS/PREVENTION

edTPA (Educative Teacher Performance Assessment) is required to be submitted to

Pearson Testing fornational scoring during Phase I of Student Teaching by all licensure areas.

Applicants who receive an 'initial' teacher's license must have successfully completed training in:

- 1. CPR/AED/Heimlich Maneuver
- 2. Suicide awareness/prevention

G. PLANNING FOR COSTS

A copy of your CPR/Heimlich/AED certification showing BOTH knowledge AND skill evaluation is required for original licensure. A certificate verifying your successful completion of a suicide awareness/prevention module is required for licensure.

Because testing, edTPA and CPR requirements have fees associated with their

implementation, candidates are encouraged to plan ahead in saving for these costs that will come in the senior year. APPROXIMATE costs:

- 1. Testing: \$120-160 per exam required
- 2. edTPA Scoring: \$300
- 3. CPR Certification: ~ \$80

NOTE: If you follow this specified plan, you will have met the core

curriculum courserequirements, the Butler University graduation course requirements, and the initial Indiana licensing course requirements.
