Roles & Responsibilities: Ensures delivery of comprehensive health care in accordance with the philosophy, standard of practice, objectives and policies of the department.

- Clinic
 - Perform physical exams, gather patient histories, prescribe medications, and document all encounters in the EPIC EMR;
 - Order appropriate labs and interpret their results;
 - Order imaging and interpret their results;
 - Collaboratively develop treatment plans with our team of doctors, nurses, and APPs;
 - Educate patients on medical conditions and suggested therapies;
 - Perform sick visits for patients needing immediate attention when the MD is not available;
 - Respond to emergencies and escalate care as required;
 - Schedule consults, follow-ups, and infusion treatments;
 - Develop new competencies through self-learning, CMEs, and participation in presentations and conferences.
- Infusion suite
 - Create and review treatment plans for patients receiving treatment;
 - Clear patients to receive treatment and obtain treatment consents;
 - Answer patient questions and concerns while receiving treatment;
 - Hold and reschedule treatment for patients who do not meet proper criteria.
- Procedures
 - Perform bone marrow biopsies. Biopsies may be done with and without general anesthesia;
 - Coordinate bone marrow biopsies with different teams within the facility;
 - Send samples to appropriate labs for testing.
- Previous medical experience is preferred but motivated new graduates will be considered. The ideal is highly motivated and will undergo rigorous training to perform procedures and interpret labs with confidence. This is a union position with 1199SEIU. No call. No weekends. No nights.

Requirements:

- For PAs: Bachelor's or Master's degree and graduation from an accredited Physician Assistant Program; New York State license and current registration as a Physician Assistant; NCCPA Certification through completion of national boards.
- For NPs: Bachelor's degree and Master's degree in Nursing. Graduate of an accredited Nurse Practitioner program. Board certification required.
- All: BLS/ACLS certification, DEA licensure, Infection control certification
- At least 1-2 years of experience preferred
